BUNCHING & GIFTS OF APPRECIATED STOCK

We've been working hard to ensure our donors are aware of two smart giving strategies that can work in tandem to maximize tax benefits: "Bunching" and Contributing Appreciated Stock.

Donors can "bunch" multiple years' worth of charitable gifts in a single year into a Donor Advised Fund (often with additional benefit by contributing appreciated stock), enabling them to surpass the itemization threshold and receive the maximum available tax advantages.
